## CLIENT ALERT: Corporate Transparency Act BOI Enforcement Suspended for U.S. Citizens and Companies

On Sunday, March 2, 2025, The United States Department of the Treasury released a statement announcing that it will not issue any fines or penalties, or pursue any enforcement, against U.S. citizens or domestic reporting companies that do not file Beneficial Ownership Information reports under the Corporate Transparency Act. The Treasury Department explained that expected rulemaking will only apply to foreign reporting companies and there will be no new requirements for domestic companies. This comes just three days after FinCEN announced an indefinite postponement to enforcement until new rulemaking was complete. The Treasury's statement can be viewed here.

President Trump celebrated this suspension as a victory for U.S. small businesses, signaling that there is not likely to be a reversal of this suspension under the current administration.
